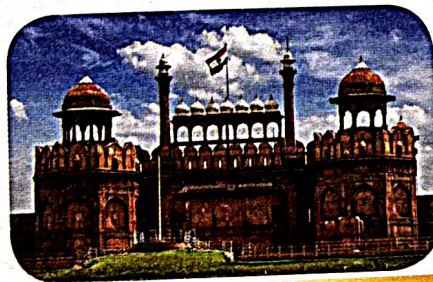
### SPECIAL NAMES AND COMMON NAMES

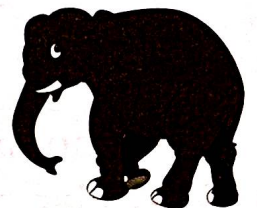

### NOUNS — NUMBERS

There are two types of nouns based on numbers. They are singular nouns and plural nouns.

- 'Singular' refers to one
- 'Plural' refers to many

Add '-s/-es' to change the nouns from 'one' to 'many'.

bag



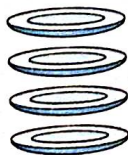
