Q2. Answer the following questions briefly -

Q3. Answer these questions in detail –

1. Swami did not want to sleep alone because he was afraid of the dark and imaginary dangers. He feared burglars, scorpions, devils and ghosts, and other unknown things. He was used to sleeping beside his grandmother and felt safe with her. Sleeping alone in the

office room made him very anxious, as he thought something bad might happen during the night.

2. After being left alone in the office room, Swami felt terrified and helpless. Every small noise scared him. Sounds like the ticking clock and rustling leaves made him imagine that someone was coming to get him. He shut his eyes as he forced himself to sleep, wrapping himself tightly with the blanket as he lay trembling with fear under the bench, feeling completely alone and helpless.

3. When Swami felt someone near him in the dark, he thought his end had come and devil had appeared to drag him out and tear him apart.
